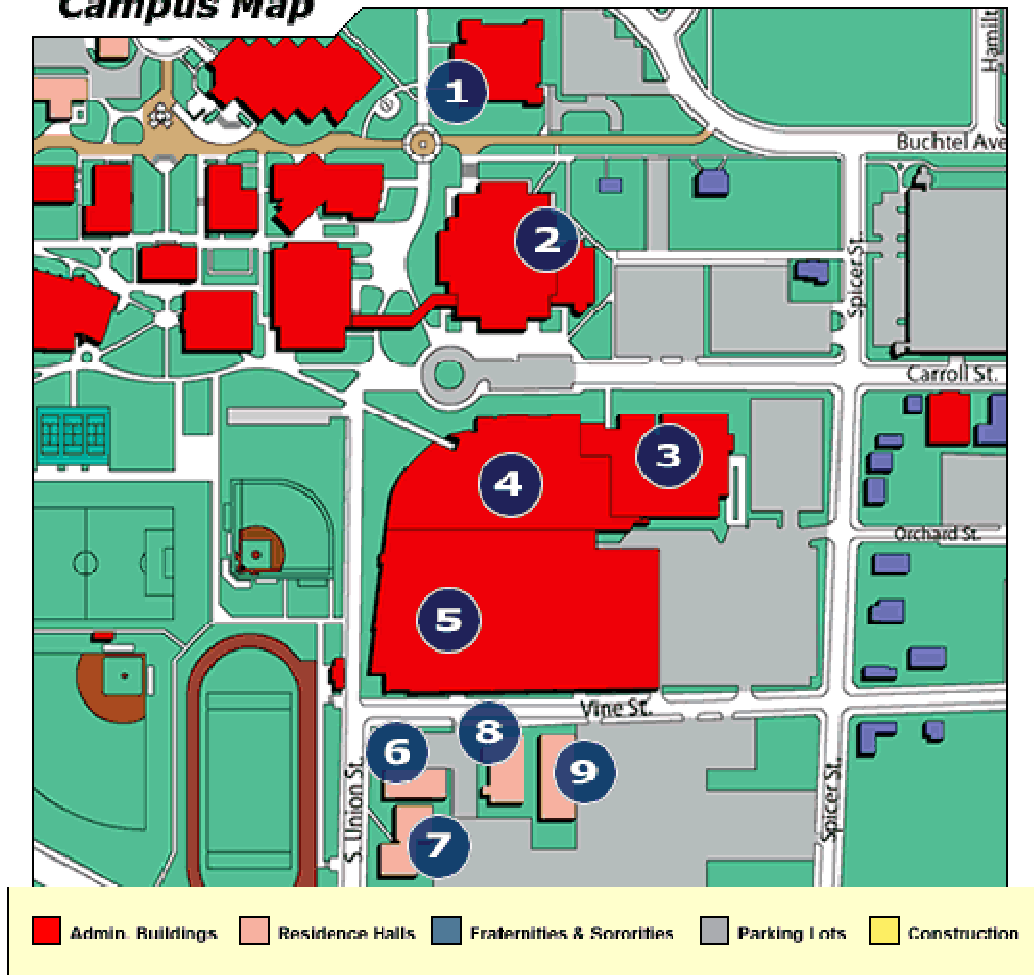

LONGHOUSE NOTES

Remember ... All Council members and Chiefs are required attend Longhouse. Chiefs, if you cannot attend, please get one of your tribe members (other than a Council member) to attend and sign in for you. **To make sure we get everything done for the Fundraiser in a timely manner, the next two Longhouses will be held on the second Tuesday of both months: January 9th and February 13th, respectively. Council will meet at 7:00 pm on both nights, joined by the Chiefs at 7:30 pm.**

CHIEF'S ACTION ITEMS SUMMARY

Our next Nation event is the University of Akron men's basketball game vs. Buffalo on Sunday January 21st at 2:00. It is a family event. The cost is \$5.00 per person and includes a game ticket and the chance to win some Zips prizes. **Headcount and money is due at the January Longhouse. Tickets will also be distributed at January Longhouse.**

The Fundraiser is only six weeks away and it is critical that we make it a success. The tickets have been distributed and each tribe is responsible for selling at least one ticket for each member of their tribe. Our goal is to sell all the tickets this year. Also, each tribe is required to contribute a minimum of two items to the silent auction. **Be ready to discuss your tribes ticket sales and your silent auction contributions at the January Longhouse.**

FASCAR kits are available from Jeff Pearce of the Comanche tribe; get one at the next event, have your Chief get one from Jeff at the next Longhouse meeting, or call Jeff at 330-714-7892. The cost remains \$5.00 per kit. The Mandan and Arapaho tribes are co-sponsor so there will be three tribes involved in car inspection and running the competition. The race will be here before you know it!!

OLD BUSINESS

November Longhouse: The December edition of *Smoke Signals* and the minutes of the November Longhouse were accepted.

Father Son Banquet Review: This was another great event. The cost was completely covered by the Nation thanks to the success of last year's Fundraiser. We will need to have another successful Fundraiser this February so the Nation can pay for this event again next year. The attendance was outstanding with over 90% of the nation participating. We took tribe pictures which will be posted in the individual tribe section of our website.

For the entertainment, we hired Dan Fladung, a real Native American, to tell stories, dance, sing, and show us authentic Indian artifacts. We need to consider having him back again at another event in the future.

The awards ceremony went very smoothly and we had a lot of folks up on the stage to receive some type of award. The Apache Tribe was the Big Medicine winner and they will get a custom tee shirt at the Spring Campout. All the tribe members of the top three finalists also received a special bead. If you are a member of the Arapaho or Mowhawk tribes and you did not get your special bead, we will have the rest of them available at the spring campout. We also had a special bead for all the braves that participated in the Y-Noah service project. There is a breakdown of all award winners listed in the back of this news letter.

NEW BUSINESS

Fundraiser Planning: The next Longhouse meeting will focus on the Fundraiser which is now six weeks away. Since we only do one per year, we need to focus on making this event a complete success.

The council is responsible for the Fundraiser, but we will need volunteers for various individual tasks, especially the night of the event. We'll discuss plans at the Longhouse next week and delegate duties and responsibilities

This year, each tribe is required to sell one Fundraiser ticket for each tribe member, including outgoing members who may become part of the new Trailblazer program. Participation in the Fundraiser is mandatory as outlined in the Nation's Constitution. In the past we have sent our kids out to sell candy with a minimum sales quota per family. There was a buyout option of \$75. Now all we ask is for each member to participate in a fun party. The Nation's goal is to sell all 300 tickets before the night of the Fundraiser.

We also need to step up the number of items available in the silent auction. We are asking for a minimum of two items per tribe, but we are not limiting the contributions to two. We want to continue having the same type of nice items that have been available in the past, but we can use lots of additional items that sell for \$20 to \$50 so that we can get more budget minded bidders involved with the silent auction. Keep this in mind when your tribe makes its contributions. We also want to step up the number of businesses that buy an advertisement in the program. We have lots of people in this Nation that work in sales and service oriented businesses that should be advertising in our program. We are considering a contest and/or medicine points to the tribe(s) that earn the most money at the Fundraiser.

Future Events: All events are planned out through the remainder of the school year. This includes dates, times, event type, budget and tribe sponsors. There is a calendar in the back of this Smoke each month with the details. Please add these events to your personal calendar and plan on participating.

Event Critiques: In the future, event critiques will be published in the Smoke and available on line at our web site.

Trailblazer Program: It was announced at the Father - Son banquet that we plan to integrate a Trailblazer program into the Manikiki Nation. We have a large number of boys that are outgoing this year or will be outgoing next year, so we have a great nucleus for the program. We will keep it under the umbrella of the Manikiki Nation so we will continue to have selected Nation events that include both Guides and Trailblazers (and maybe even Princesses). The Trailblazers will also include a selection of events that are more age appropriate and interesting for boys in Middle School. We also plan to have the boys be more involved with the leadership structure and the organization of these events.

The current time table is to get a group of Dad's to form a committee which will start meeting right after we get through the Fundraiser. We would like to be ready to launch the program at our spring campout. Until the program becomes official, all outgoing little braves are still invited and encouraged to attend and participate in our Nation events this spring.

Constitution Committee: In order to create a Trailblazer program within the Manikiki Nation, we will need to amend the Constitution. We also have several other items in the Constitution that have become outdated or irrelevant. This committee will be the same group of dads that organize the Trailblazers discussed above. If you are interested in being involved, please let Scott "Singin' Moose" Summers know between now and the Fundraiser.
