# **"BLOWIN' SMOKE"**

Greetings Manikiki Nation. There are lots of things happening right now that once again demonstrate what a great organization we are all a part of. Most of you had a great time at the FAScar competition: my son's favorite non-camping event. Since this is an indoor event, next year we'll move it to January or February so it doesn't conflict with all the sports our kids participate in. I would like to personally thank the Comanche Tribe, specifically Tom Knobel and Jeff Pierce, and the co-sponsoring Arapaho and Mandan Tribes, for making this event so successful. Maybe next year I'll start working on our car before the week of the race.

In addition to this month's Spring Campout at Y-Noah, we have lots of great events planned for the summer, including a Family Picnic on Sunday, July 29<sup>th</sup>. We have invited our sister group, the Iroquois Nation Indian Princesses, to join in on the fun. If you have a daughter between K and 8<sup>th</sup> grade, and you are not a part of their group, you need to consider joining up with them. Be sure to bring your daughter to the Picnic and use the opportunity to meet the Princesses.

We are also be partnering with the Indian Princesses and in the Green Relay for Life, a fundraiser that supports the American Cancer Society. We have been doing this event for the last four years and this year we want more members to get involved. It counts as a make-up event, and can also be used to make-up the community service project. Mohawk tribe member Jim Cross and I are taking over the leadership this year and we are asking everyone to step up and help the Manikiki and Iroquois Nations make a strong showing. It will also be a lot of fun with activities all night and the option to pitch a tent and camp out. If you have friends or loved ones who have battled with cancer, you owe it to them and to yourself to participate in this community service project. In other words, the only excuse I will accept for missing this event is if you have **never** had someone close to you suffer from this terrible disease. Since last year's Relay for Life, my wife's best friend passed away while still in her 40's and two weeks ago my uncle died. I suspect that I am not alone with these types of experiences so I look forward to seeing all of you at the Green High School football stadium on Friday night, June 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Last month we had our first Trailblazers steering committee meeting, and I have attached the notes from the meeting at the end of *Smoke*. If you have a son in the program's age bracket, join us after lunch at the Spring Campout to kick off the plan. We'll set up a cool event sometime this summer to get things started. This is going to be a great program and there is already a lot of excitement and enthusiasm from the potential members.

Finally, I was proud to see the large number of Nation members who participated in the Green YMCA Partners With Youth fundraiser a couple of weeks ago. We have traditionally sponsored a table at this event to show our support for our parent organization. This year we had at least 19 big braves attend the fundraiser with our significant others which demonstrated to the Green YMCA that we are a big supporter of their efforts in our community. Flying Hawk, Soaring Hawk and Sitting Hawk were fortunate to visit the Pima, Navajo and Hopi lands on their Spring Break this year. Here is a mystical story of how we came to earth according to the Hopi and Navajo People.

## *The Holy Mountain*

*Many thousands of years ago, the great Kachina flew from outer space and hovered among the clouds of the highest mountain in Arizona, now known as the San Francisco peaks. From many moons and galaxies far, far away, the great Kachina star ship descended out of the clouds and landed in the great mountain above Flagstaff.*

*The Great Spirit placed these space travelers in northern Arizona who have occupied the cliffs, caves and Hogan's for over 4,000 years. The Great Kachina came to save the earth, the water, the creatures and to populate our world in His likeness. Today's Southwestern tribes respect*

*and are reverent to the Holy Mountain. The Great Spirit through the Kachina promises all our braves that he will come again to the Holy Mountain to save us once again.*

This sacred story is over 4,000 years old. Think how this parallels our Judaic and Christian beliefs waiting for this saving return.

Although some of the difference is certainly due to strong recruiting efforts, I wonder if we have too many Braves who join Guides because it's free to Y members and then don't participate in the Fundraiser? When comparing tribe size to the number of Fundraiser tickets purchased per tribe, some of the larger tribes are clearly being carried by the smaller tribes ... especially the Mingo.

Our constitution recommends a tribe size of six to ten Big Braves ... our larger tribes are well above that. Is that best for the Nation? Should we take a look at tribe size, Fundraiser sales by tribe, and the number of Y members vs. non-Y members in each tribe? I think we gain something if all of our tribes have strong membership and we should know where we stand.

On a lighter note, I surrender ... from now on it's FAScar, not FASCAR.

First meeting was attended by Scott Summers, Tom Knoebel, Randy Wallace, Gregg Badalich, Pat Duff, and Tom Turner.

### **Defined age range for two groups**

- We discussed age range and decided to go with 5<sup>th</sup> grade as a transition year
- Guides will be K through 5<sup>th</sup>
- Trailblazers will be 5<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> although we may not set and outgoing age
- 5<sup>th</sup> grader boys and/or their dads can decide which program to be a part of
- This will give us a good core group of 45 to 50 boys to get things started
- Tribe situation is yet to be determined but Tribes may stay the same

### **Constitution**

- The constitution will need to be modified to incorporate Trailblazers, but we have to get the program going and do some experimentation and study before we decide how to approach rewriting the constitution
- We may still make a few small changes in the current version and put some timelines in writing for making the final modifications that include trailblazers
- In the interim, all plans will be voted on by a combination of chiefs, Council and the steering committee

### **Council representation**

- This is yet to be determined but we will at least need to add one more Council member to represent the Trailblazers
- Perhaps we will have a Nation or Federation Chief, a Guides Chief of Chiefs (instead of the War Chief), and a Trailblazers Chief of Chiefs
- The rest of the Council members can be a mix of both groups
- We will also have the kids involved with decisions so we may create some Trailblazer leadership positions that are designed for the boys

## **Trailblazer Steering Committee Meeting Notes (page 2)**

### **Plans for Nation Events**

- Initially we will do six full Nation events and six individual group events
- We will try to alternate months whenever possible
- Individual Guides events will be designed for younger boys and may not even interest boys in middle school grades.
- We will encourage the Guides to start having more tribe events in homes
- Trailblazer events will be more challenging, and include planning and decision making by the boys
- One campout will be for the entire Nation, other campouts will be determined at budget meeting this summer

### **Program will be introduced at Camp Y-Noah.**

- We will announce the program at a lunch and then have the dad's and boys stay for a Trailblazer startup meeting after lunch
- We will introduce the program and then vote on our first Trailblazer event to take place later this summer
- We will also have something special for the older boys to do at the campout

### **Possible Summer Event**

- We will propose several choices at the Y-Noah meeting and let the boys vote
- Here are some options:
  - Primitive campout with more challenging activities
  - White water rafting trip
  - Charter fishing boat on Lake Erie with a campout on an island
  - Father/Son golf outing/campout
  - Laser Tag or Paint Ball outing

### **Budget Meeting**

- We will need to have a plan for events put together before the July/August budget meeting which will be approved by the leadership in attendance
- It was suggested that we consider using some budget surplus to seed the program
- The steering committee will put together some recommendations and ask for a vote from the Manikiki leadership

### **Fall Campout**

- The fall campout is both the final event for the fiscal year and the kickoff event for next year
- A big part of the fire ceremony will be the formal launch of the Trailblazer program
- There will be separate events and Nation games available for both groups

### **Future**

- Trailblazers boys will be responsible leaders at all combined events
- Trailblazer boys will be more involved with event planning and the newsletter
- There will be an awards system created to reward community service and achieving goals ... a bit like merit badges in Boy Scouts
