### **CHIEF'S ACTION ITEMS SUMMARY**

When it comes to my personal computer and emails – I am a bit of a pack rat. I like to save everything. Even when I upgrade computers I like to copy everything from the old computer to the new, and then when I upgrade again – I copy everything, again and again and again. I never like to delete old files and emails.

Well, fortunately for me hard drive (HD) space is cheep and only gets cheaper by the month. This month I just bought a 320gig drive for \$60. That's about .19 cents per gig of storage. The issue for me is not storing stuff it's finding it. To solve that issue there are two tools out there – "Windows desktop search" and "Google Desktop search". These tools allow you to search your desktop as you would the internet. They search most all types of files, from emails, word, PowerPoint and .PDF files. As far as the desktop search engines, they also directly integrate into the web, so you can search the web and your HD at the same time. The only downside is the performance degrade these tools can have on your entire system. It's easy to imagine that they have to do a lot of processing/searching of your files; so they take up some computer power. The software makers claim that they only use your computer during time when you are not and only in the background, but I don't believe them. I see a performance hit especially during startup for Google. However it's easy to shut the darn thing off if you are not using it.

# **"BLOWIN' SMOKE"**

The following excerpts come from the Fire Ceremony last month at Camp Y Noah

Nation Chief, Singin' Moose from the Cherokee Tribe: "We have a great group of men leading this powerful nation starting with the Tribe Chiefs. I am proud to have this opportunity to serve you as Nation Chief but the best leaders know that it requires a strong and unified team working together to be successful. It is our Tribe Chiefs and the men who serve on Council that make this Nation strong. I would like to ask these Big Braves who serve on our council to step forward to share the teachings of the Great Spirit."

Sachem, Running Bull from the Mohawk Tribe: "Each Council member of the Manikiki Nation Council was given a message that the Great Spirit would like you to learn. By themselves they are good lessons but together they create values to live your life by".

Nation War Chief, Big Bear from the Apache Tribe: "The first fire is the fire of the Spirit. This fire represents the character of all Indian Guides. You must at all times do your best to set a good example, to be friendly, courteous, respectful, and considerate in your work and play."

Tally Keeper, Howling Wolf of the Arapaho Tribe: "The second fire is the fire of the Mind. This fire represents learning all that we can about our world and the people in it. Each of us must also learn to be honest and true to ourselves and also to everyone else."

Wampum Bearer, Big Bad Wolf for the Navajo Tribe: "The third fire is the fire of the Body. We must develop our bodies to serve us, and to make it a temple of the Great Spirit. Body also means courage. It takes courage to do many things: to play challenging games, to defend you, to walk in darkness, but it takes more courage to say "NO" to that which is wrong! It is this courage that a young Brave needs to develop."

Medicine Man, Sits By Fire of the Apache Tribe: "The forth fire is the fire of Family. The family is the glue that holds our lives together. A strong family unit provides a safe harbor for all braves to return to when we need to recharge. Honor your grand parents for they are wise I the ways of the world and have much to teach you. Show respect and manners to the women of your family for they nurture all life. Do not fight with your brothers and sisters so that they can be your best friends for a lifetime. Finally, live your life for your children for through them your legacy can live forever

Web Spinner Big Dog from the Cherokee Tribe: "The fifth fire is the fire of Friendship. It is important to be pure and honest and courageous but there is something else. We should always be friendly. Helping others gives each of us on of the greatest thrills in life. To have many friends is our greatest and most cherished possession. Being courteous, kind, and helpful will make others happy, creating friendships will make you happy too."

Story Teller, Sitting Hawk from the Kickapoo Tribe: "The sixth fire is the fire of Community. Within our village we have teachers to help us learn the ways of life, Doctors to heal us when we become sick and injured, Policemen to protect us from evil, farmers who grow the food we eat, and builders who make the houses that shelter us. Every one of these important occupations are represented right here in the Manikiki Nation. We must show thanks and appreciation by working hard and contributing to our community.
